I. From opposite directions two great processions came; one in the name of Power, one in Salvation's name.

One from Oppression's palace beneath an emp'ror's thumb.

- 2. From opposite directions rode Pontius Pilate in, expediency's servant, the willing slave of sin; and Jesus Christ, a servant to love which never dies, to God, to us, to Meaning, to dreadful sacrifice.
