Scripture Sentences

words from John 20:

Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, Peace be with you! Then he said to Thomas: 'Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Stop doubting and believe'. Thomas said to him: 'My Lord and my God'. Then Jesus told him: 'Because you have seen me, you have believed, blessed are those who have not seen me yet have believed'.

Invitation

As the disciples of Jesus once gathered around a table with their Lord in an Upper Room, so we come, separately in our homes, yet united together in a spirit of communion.

We do so deeply conscious that, wherever we are, God meets us in bread and wine, symbols of the life given up for us in the death of the Lord Jesus Christ upon Good Friday's cross.

We also come rejoicing in the reality of resurrection.
