The 'owner' of the fig tree in Jesus' fig tree tale was clear the tree was useless no good to him at all. A fig tree that is fig-less does not deserve its place "Remove this monstrous failure, it's just a waste of space!" The Gard'ner in the story then asked to call a halt; what if this fig-less failure was not the fig tree's fault? He promised new resources, new care, with new manure, "Perhaps, we failed the fig tree, let's try to find a cure!"

The story Jesus offers, if we have ears to hear, provides a heart-felt challenge to things we may think clear; when we think like the 'owner', and blame, condemn, remove, we crush all hope of justice and shut down truth and love.

Today, we need this story to help us think again, when some are set for failure, whilst others just condemn; Let's reconstruct our nurture, let's give each fig their chance, let's show all fig trees matter, let fruitfulness advance!
